can begin to feel the silence as God's invitation to rest and be still, and we can begin to experience the darkness around us as the embrace of God - a God who is present - maybe even more powerfully in our pain, and a God who promises that it will not be dark forever.

Tomorrow there will be just a little more light than today. You may not have noticed, but slowly spring will come again.

May it be the same way as God brings the light of hope into your life and into our world.
